As mentioned in last month's letter, we gave out the assignments and prayed for God's grace and blessing for this special year in the students lives.

The team also helped with the New Girls Dorm construction project, helped paint the Chapel and several sewing projects with the ladies. They visited the churches of **Neria, El Pochote, and La Cumbre, Belen and Vega del Sol**, preaching and sharing with the children in each place. This is the first visiting group of our school year and is always a special encouragement for the new students that have just arrived to prepare for ministry.

This month, we had our first "**Music and Technological Resources Congress**" for church and worship leaders in the region. The theme was "Exalt His Glory" and the central message was that

There were classes

on forming choirs, voice training, leading worship with guitar, sound system setup, video presentations for church worship and many other very useful topics. **Danny Hernandez** was our conference speaker, emphasizing the previously stated theme and messages. It was a tremendous time of learning the Scriptures, of worship and fellowship. Over 500 brethren representing churches from many places in southern Mexico came to learn during this activity. The leaders that came were very grateful for this blessing that the Lord provided here in Cordoba.

The Lord gives us many opportunities and “instruments” to share the Word of God with unbelievers. As you know, medical ministries have been a great part of our mission work here in Mexico. The **Woodcreek Church Dental Team** has faithfully come for many years to partner with us for the extension of the Gospel. Led by **Dr. Chris Miller**, this group sets up three clinics in three days to do all sorts of dental work on people with needs. Each year with this group of brethren, we have been able to reach new locations where there is no evangelical witness. This time the places visited were **Tezonapa** and **Neria**, while the new village for the clinic this year was **Xochiapan**, a town up in the mountains above Cordoba. We were invited to go to this new place by former Veracruz congresswoman **Gely Sahagun** (who has also become instrumental for us to go places we have never been before). While the doctors work do the dental work, our students visit with the patients and children teaching the Truth of Christ and sharing His love. **Drs. Miller, Stuttzman, Brodie, and Mason** worked untiringly, seeing hundreds of patients in these clinics. We are very thankful for our brethren and this ministry of **Woodcreek Church** with us.

We thank the Lord for His blessing on these first months of the school year and for your prayers, love, and support, that makes it possible for us to do these things and continue to serve the Lord here in Mexico. May He keep us delighting in His Word and sharing it with all whom we meet each day.
