The other side is the spiritual development and growth in the Word of God of each of the choir members. The students practice every Saturday evening from two to four hours all year long. During the practice time, they not only learn the Scriptures through the messages they sing, but also through stud-

ies and devotionals prepared for them. This in turn is a great blessing for the youth, their families and for the fifteen churches represented in the choir, all of which are part of the MITC outreach in the region. There are many things in this world that can hinder our youth from following the Lord. This choir has been a great blessing in the lives of each member. We are especially thankful for the ministry of **Marco and Esdras (Ez) Barroso** that are in charge of the United Youth Choir ministry and are greatly used by the Lord.





We thank the Lord for the opportunity begin a new construction project here on campus, in which we also desire to glorify Him. The building will be on the property next to our Chapel and will contain three large classrooms to help accommodate our students in Full Time Bible School, Saturday Seminary and Christian Music School. One of the

rooms will be designated as a Music Room. From time to time, these same classrooms will be converted into **Operating Rooms, Consult Rooms**, and **Pre and Post Op wards** for our visiting medical and surgical teams from the United States. These teams honor the Lord and give testimony to the love of Jesus through the use of medical skills, consults and surgerical procedures performed free of charge for people with great needs in this part of Mexico. These new medical facilities will



be especially useful during our eye surgery campaigns, dental services and general consult clinics. The plan for the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor will be rooms and dorms to house our visitors who come to serve with us and also for attendees to our camps, **Bible Conferences** and **Congresses**, held throughout the year. We have named this building the **Villa Classroom** 

Medical project (VCM Project). We pray that the Lord will receive glory in its provision and use.

Two of our graduates from the Full Time Bible School, Basilio (2013) and Veronica (2011), gave glory to God by joining in marriage to form a family that will serve the Lord. The wedding was in Vero's small Chinanteco village of "La Soledad." Both of these brethren have been serving the Lord as

missionaries in **Puebla** and we know the Lord will continue to use them in His work. We give thanks to God for this new family.

Many of our students, like Veronica, come from the rural areas in the mountains. For the people in these areas living in a subsistence economy, their basic needs have to do with nutrition. So, agriculture and animal husbandry are fundamental in a family's development. For many years, part of our program in the Full Time Bible School has included home gardening and animal husbandry. Our students learn to grow vegetables (and to prepare and eat them) and also how to raise chickens, laying hens, rabbits and pigs. As they return to their missions, these



techniques become very valuable helps for nutrition and home economy. The vegetables and meat from the programs also benefit the food needs here on campus. We thank the Lord for these things, in which we also seek to glorify His name.

May the Lord bless each of you. Thank you for your prayers, love and support for us, and may we all give Him Glory each day. As Paul says, "Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father." Col 3:17
