In the Saturday Seminary Program this year, we have thirty-seven adults enrolled. So in both Bible Schools this year, we have a total of ninety-eight students, praise the Lord! In the recently opened Christian Music School, there are presently sixty-five aspiring musicians of all ages. They are learning music to serve in the churches as worship leaders and playing instruments for the services. We pray the Lord will pour out His grace upon the students and staff of all these programs, as His Word goes forth in the 2013-2014 school year.

Our Alumni **Elia Juan** has come to serve with us here on campus as the new Girls Dorm Prefect. Last year, during her year of practice, she was a missionary to the Church at **El Cacique** and the mission at **Cacalotepec** and was used greatly by the Lord. Elia is from the Chinanteco Mountains and the village of **Santiago Tlatepuzco**. We pray for her ministry among us, especially as she works closely with the young ladies, encouraging them in their Christian disciplines and walk with the Lord.

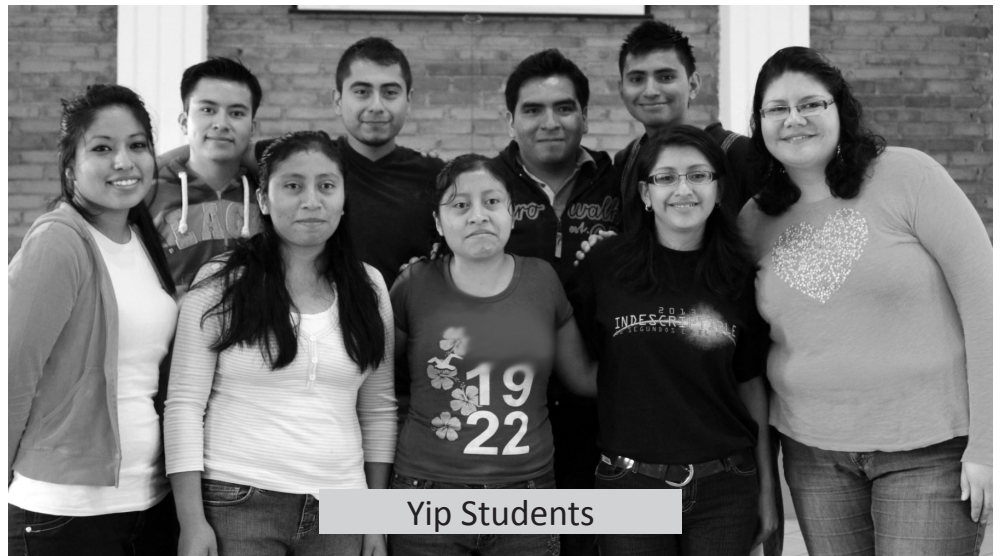

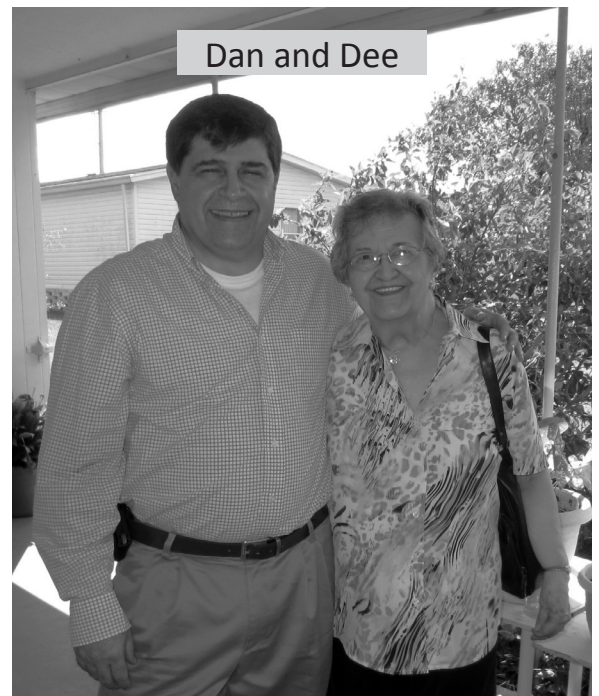
