

Sending these students out is always a very emotional time, as they leave the “Home” and “go forth” with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. MITC board member, Brother **Gary Richardson** has been a special encouragement for the Year in Practice students for many years. He comes down to be a part of their commissioning each September, then returns to see them at the December Bible conference and finally at their graduation. This year was no exception, as we had a multi-state group led by **Gary, Eber Flores and Dick Patterson**. This team of twenty-one brethren was here to serve the Lord, working on much needed maintenance, construction, carpentry, painting

and sewing projects here on the compound. The group leaders, along with **Pastor Tim Tallent**, preached in Chapel services and at local churches during the week. A special treat during the week was a Jambalaya dinner cooked by Gary for the whole mission family!

The presence of this group was a special encouragement as we began the **new school year**. God has blessed us with **sixty-four** students in the Full Time Program, **sixty-three** students in the Saturday Seminary, and **sixty** in the Christian Music School. All of this provided for by the grace of God through His children that pray and give of themselves to the Lord on our behalf. Our desire is that each of these students will become well trained in the Scriptures through our Bible Programs to be a strong witness for the Lord Jesus. We pray they also become experienced in evangelism as they participate in the many outreach events, concerts, camps, and medical ministries. We pray and look to



the Lord for these basic things in the lives of our students, as well as their personal development and a growing and deep relationship with the Lord. We trust that they will acquire skills to help support themselves as they go to serve in the mountains, learning in the “on campus” work areas of animal husbandry (chickens, pigs, rabbits), gardening, carpentry, welding, coffee production, sewing, cooking, and crafts. Thank you for joining us in these prayers on their behalf.



The **Woodcreek Dental** team led by **Dr. Chris Miller**, has been an integral part of the MITC outreach for many years. Chris began coming down in the 1980's as part of the Richland Bible medical team. Years later, he started a dental missionary team to come and do dentistry in daylong clinics to share the Gospel and the love of Christ. With this team, we leave out early in the morning to a selected town or village and set up the mobile clinic. We then share with the patients and their families and friends, the reason for the help we are giving before starting the dental work. Then, as patients wait for their turn to see the dentists, our students preach and share one on one and also have

Bible classes and games with the children. This ministry has always been a special means of opening doors to the ministry of MITC in new locations. It also is a great reinforcement to the witness of local churches and help to the congregation that host the clinic. Joining with Chris were **Drs. Steve and Mike** and a group of assistants that are all a super efficient and hard working group. God has blessed their work through the years and the authorities in Cordoba have welcomed this team enabling us to go to many villages in the region where we have no church contacts or believers. We are thankful to God for these brethren and for the way the Word of Christ continues to go forth through their service and skills used here in Mexico in the Name of the Lord.
